Terms of employment in Finland

- In Finland, you never need to pay to get a job.
- Working without pay is only possible in the TE Office's work try-out or practical training related to studiés.
- Pay cannot be agreed upon freely;
 the minimum wage depends on the sector in question and the employee's work experience.
- It is normal that
 - a minimum wage is more than EUR 8 per hour
 - and regular working hours do not exceed 40 hours a week.
- Provisions on working hours and pay can be found in the collective agreement for the sector in question.



If problems arise at a workplace

- If a worker encounters problems or questions at their workplace related to their employment relationship, the worker can contact the occupational safety and health authority (AVI):


